What you can **realistically expect** from a System Review.

SHARPER PROBLEM DEFINITION

- The issue becomes easier to define and communicate
- Symptoms are separated from the likely system cause

2



ROOT-CAUSE HYPOTHESIS

- A deep architectural view of what may really drive the issue
- A more intelligent starting point for the next decisions

TOP 3 SIGNALS IDENTIFIED

- The strongest warning signs or leverage points are surfaced quickly
- Typical signals: ownership, decision speed, process flow, governance friction

IMMEDIATE NEXT-STEP RECOMMENDATION

- A concrete next move you can act on right away
- Clarity on whether to pause, escalate, align, redesign, or deepen analysis



WHAT YOU GAIN

- ✓ Senior outside-in perspective

- ✓ Actionable guidance
- ✓ Better decision clarity



TYPICAL FOLLOW-UP OPTIONS

- ✓ Repeat System Review on another issue
- ✓ Upgrade to Executive Diagnosis

EXAMPLE CLIENT OUTPUT

Illustrative example — the **actual content** depends on the client challenge.

1 CLIENT CHALLENGE BROUGHT INTO THE SESSION



- Too many initiatives, too little execution flow
- Decisions escalate instead of moving
- Technology discussions are ahead of operating model clarity

2 WHAT BECAME VISIBLE



- Ownership is blurred across functions
- Decision rights are not explicit
- Process friction is compensated by meetings
- Governance protects alignment but slows momentum

3 SYSTEM DIAGNOSIS HYPOTHESIS



- The problem is not a lack of effort
- The real issue is weak execution architecture
- People are compensating for a system that was never fully designed end-to-end

4 TOP 3 SIGNALS DETECTED

OWNERSHIP
GAPDECISION SPEED
BOTTLENECKFRAGMENTED
OPERATING LOGIC

5 IMMEDIATE NEXT MOVE



- Clarify who owns the cross-functional flow
- Define the decisions that must happen without escalation
- Test where governance adds safety vs. delay

6 WHAT THE CLIENT LEAVES WITH



- A sharpened problem statement
- A first root-cause hypothesis
- The 3 most important system signals
- A recommended next step



The System Review condenses complexity into a few high-value insights. It's designed to **create clarity** — not more slides.
